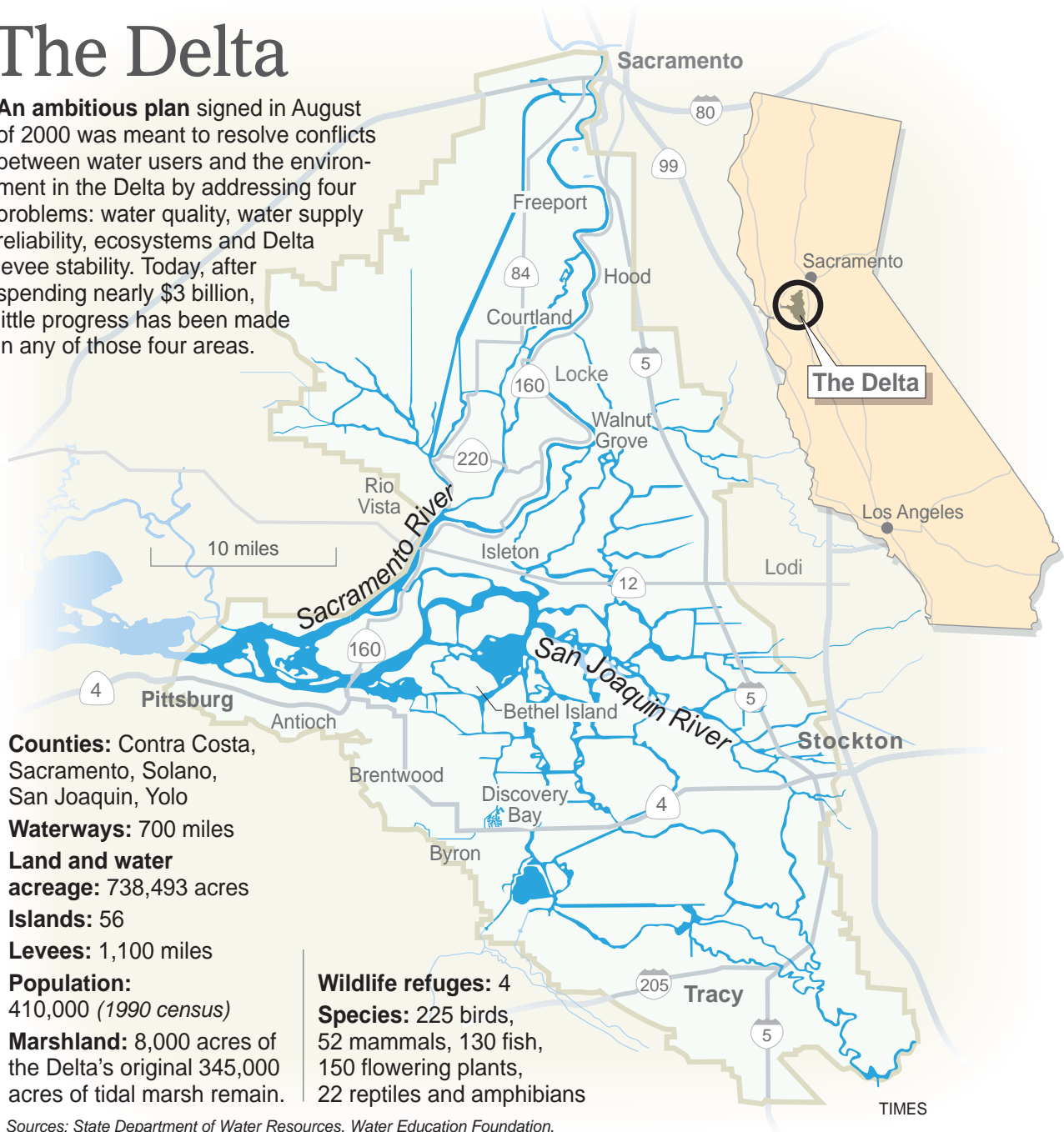


The Delta

An ambitious plan signed in August of 2000 was meant to resolve conflicts between water users and the environment in the Delta by addressing four problems: water quality, water supply reliability, ecosystems and Delta levee stability. Today, after spending nearly \$3 billion, little progress has been made in any of those four areas.



Counties: Contra Costa, Sacramento, Solano, San Joaquin, Yolo

Waterways: 700 miles

Land and water acreage: 738,493 acres

Islands: 56

Levees: 1,100 miles

Population: 410,000 (1990 census)

Marshland: 8,000 acres of the Delta's original 345,000 acres of tidal marsh remain.

Wildlife refuges: 4

Species: 225 birds, 52 mammals, 130 fish, 150 flowering plants, 22 reptiles and amphibians
