## Glaucidium brasilianum medianum subsp. nov.

Brown phase: differs from Glaucidium brasilianum ridgwayi Sharpe in the much browner, less grayish tone of the upper parts, and in the decidedly more rufescent, less grayish, color of the streaks of the under parts. From Glaucidium brasilianum phalænoides (Daudin) it differs in its paler, more buffy brown color above, less heavily streaked under parts, and more decidedly and more regularly barred tail.

## Faico fusco-cœrulescens septentrionalis aubsp. nov.

Similar in color to Falco fusco-cærulescens fusco-cærulescens Vieillot, but decidedly larger. Wing (female), 294; tail, 201; exposed culmen, 20; tarsus, 49; (male; type) wing, 267; tail, 180; exposed culmen, 22.5; tarsus, 47.
