year ago today, more than a billion gallons of toxic coal ash — waste from a coal-fired power plant operated by the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) — flooded this quiet residential community along the Clinch and Emory Rivers in Tennessee when the dam holding back the ash failed. There are hundreds of other sites just like this one around the country, threatening nearby residents, drinking water, fish and wildlife with arsenic, lead, mercury, selenium and other dangerous toxins in the ash.
