Endangered SoCal frog getting a new lease March in response to legal action by the Center for Biological Diversity the U.S. fish and Wildlife service has finalised a recovery plan to help save the mountain yellow legged Frogs once the most abundant amphibian in the Sierra Nevada and transverse ranges the Frogs used to live across a wide range of elevations and wetland habitat in southern California since the 1900s they've disappeared from nearly all of their former range with non-native predators and pollution their biggest threat the recovery plan prioritizes the continuation of captive breeding efforts and of meant nation of existing populations
