



HAWAIIANS SUPPORT MONK SEAL PROTECTIONS


Based on what know about Hawaiian monk seals, do you think they are an important part of Hawaii's natural heritage, or not?




The federal government recently designated almost 7,000 square miles as protected critical habitat for monk seals in Hawaii. Do you support or oppose this designation?
